

Chat Cap is a language app where people come together to chat in English and soon to be available in multiple languages. Chat Cap is strictly speaking. Not a social media either.

Cap stands for "Captivated" and the slogan is "Captivated in your Language."

Instead of the traditional teacher to student learning experience, it's done between students to student. So the student will select their level and there are three: Advanced Beginner, Intermediate, and Advanced. There is no "beginning" level because the students must know more than just the ABC's. Then the student will find someone from the other side of the world who is the same level more or less. They will do a lesson designed by Chat Cap through live audio based on their level, with examples, ideas and sample sentences by the native speaker. A native speaker is never present. There is only an example. This is strictly between non native speakers. So lets say two students join a one on one chat room and in the middle of their screen will show the lesson.

The first is Q&A. A question pops up on the screen and the two students will answer and share their thoughts. Then there is a native's sample answer on the native sample icon at the bottom. Second is vocabulary. The word, definition and the native's example sentence will show on the screen. Then they read it, translate it to their own language and once they understand the word, they try to make their own sentence. Third is idiom and this is similar to vocabulary. The idiom and the sample sentence is shown and they can translate it and make their own sentences. The fourth is role play. A certain dialogue pops on the screen and they listen to the native first and then they read it or act it out. There is an explanation of the dialogue in English and they can translate it. Certain words can be translated too. Fifth is pictures for beginning - intermediate levels only, where a pic will show and they will describe it together. It may be hard to describe it for some people so there is a native's sample sentence. For the other two upper levels is freestyle where they play truth or false. Each student tells their personal true story and make up one false story. Sixth and the last one is tongue twisters. This gives the students a chance to practice their pronunciation.
